Celebrating 100 Years of Chevrolet, GM

2011 is the 100th birthday of Chevrolet and General Motors and we can look forward to a whole year of events and media coverage. Commemorative events have already been held at major shows and auctions around the country, including the Detroit Auto Show. Watch the automotive press for other events around the country.

Several activities will be held in Flint, Michigan, historical home of Chevy. The Vintage Chevrolet Club will hold its own 50th anniversary celebration in Flint July 17-23. Started by 12 people in 1961, the club now has 80,000 members in 27 states. Hemmings Motor News and others will cover their celebration. Flint has not produced Chevrolets for many years; most are now built in Canada and Mexico.

100 years, continued

Chevrolet's most famous engine was not an LS V-8 but rather the 216 cubic inch "stove bolt six", made from the 1930s to the 1970s. It was one of the earliest popular overhead valve engines. Early models had cast iron pistons and no oil pump, oil filter or insert engine bearings. Though usually not quite as fast, the U.S. Army believed a Chevy six would outlast a Ford V-8 by at least two to one.

In 1911, famed race driver Louis Chevrolet was approached by entrepreneur extraordinaire William Durant to help form the Chevrolet car brand. Durant also bought Buick and Cadillac, founded GM, and virtually invented automobile marketing. Chevrolet division went on to sell over 200 million cars in 130 countries over the next 100 years, including 1.5 million Corvettes.

9 More Convertibles Needed for April 30 RIR Event *Rick Franklin, O.D.*

Richmond International Raceway has asked the Club to provide 43 convertible Corvettes and drivers and several backups to serve as pre-race driver introduction lap vehicles. The event is the **Crown Royal Presents the Matthew and Daniel Hansen 400** NASCAR Sprint Cup Series race on Saturday, April 30. Online only registration opened March 1 at <http://springrir2011.eventbrite.com/>.

In return for our service, RIR will provide a car corral on the midway for us to showcase our vehicles in front of tens of thousands of race fans prior to the race. Your Corvette may be positioned in the car corral starting at 10 a.m. but no later than 2 p.m. on Saturday. RIR will also provide protection from outside elements in the Colonial Building. Each driver will be issued a vehicle permit to access the grounds through the Service Gate off Richmond-Henrico Turnpike, and credentials to get through the tunnel to the infield.

As in 2010, a double blind draw will be held to determine the NASCAR ride along driver at 2:30 p.m. This procedure generates excitement and scrambling among some CCR members in securing their preferred NASCAR driver. As with last year, if you are not on site by 2 p.m., you will not be eligible to participate in the driver draw, and your spot will be made available to the next CCR member based on timestamp in Eventbrite.

One hour prior to race time, Corvettes will parade onto the infield and positioned on the track to pick up the NASCAR drivers as they are introduced to the crowd. No additional persons may be in the Corvette during the parade lap. RIR will have a photographer on hand to photograph each Vette, passenger and CCR driver during their parade lap. The vehicles will take one low speed lap (10-15 mph), enter the pit road at Turn 4, let the driver off at his racecar, and proceed back to the car corral area. RIR will issue grandstand reserved seats for each driver and one guest to watch the race.

Schedule and tasks are tentative, based on weather conditions and NASCAR approval. **This activity is open to current CCR members only.** Use of Club windshield decals is encouraged in order to promote CCR. **A practice run is now scheduled for April 12 at 5 p.m. at RIR and we will meet at the RIR ticket office area. Parking passes will be available for pickup beginning March 26, 2011.**

Going Back in Time with CCR

Part 3 of a Series of 10

Hello, CCR Members and Web Readers! I am the historian of CCR’s archives and have been asked to write about these treasures I have in my possession. With some help from Lori, each month you will go back in time with me as I review the history of CCR in five-year time blocks.

The year was 1996...

Going Back in Time, continued...

I am the club president with big shoes to fill following in the footsteps of Grand Poobah, Bob Clifton, and this was Lori's ninth and final year as newsletter editor (*she claims I overworked her!*). New members that year included Jimmy and Pat Brice, Nick and Nancy Lappa, and Don and Joanne Stahr. From a newsletter I see we had a '69 white roadster for \$10,500. The club was growing and it wasn't unusual for us to have 100 members attend monthly meetings at the Lawyers Title Building. By midyear, our membership stood at 151 and at year-end treasurer Terry Corbin reported our balance as \$1,291.

1996 was a year of many firsts (*and many rebirths from the Club's past*). Bylaws were changed to make it easier for applicants to become members. We brought in CCR T-shirts and Club jackets, CCR name tags (*I have such a bad time with names!*), car decals, business cards and memo pads. It had been over 10 years since we had any sponsors and in 1996 **Zip Products**, **Heritage Chevrolet** and **Luck Chevrolet** became (*and still are*) our sponsors!

Some of 1996's events included: Crab Cruise to Capt. Billy's (*sponsored then by Aquia Creek Corvette Club*), poker run, drag racing at Richmond Dragway, homecoming parades, a photo shoot at Bellwood and, after about a 10 year lapse, we brought back our Christmas dinner dances. Trish and Tim Richmond organized a Royal Caribbean CORVETTE CRUISE sailing from Los Angeles to Cabo San Lucas. After we participated in Zip Products' three-day Corvette Expo, we began talks with Zip and our Corvette Roundup was born the next year!

News from Other Clubs

The Corvette Club of America in Washington, D.C. claims to be the oldest Corvette Club in the U.S. They recently held a karting event for members and a "Teen Driving School" for local teenagers.

The **Nuts, Bolts and Vettes** of the **Lone Star Corvette Club** in Plano, Texas sells full and half page ads to local advertisers in their glossy printed newsletter. The club sponsored an event for the Make-a-Wish Foundation, providing rides and entertainment for kids at a local track.

The **Vette Gazette** of the **Utah Corvette Club** in Salt Lake announced their annual banquet in honor of long time members and leaders. The club schedules "pop up socials" where members can meet at local restaurants to eat and socialize between meetings and major events.

The **Virginia Corvette Club** in Lynchburg has begun promoting their "Vettes on the Point" event to be held this year on Sept. 30 to Oct. 1. Last year, the club earned enough to donate \$6,500 to local charities.
